Introductions

Approval of Spring 2017 Minutes –with edits AND change the title to SPRING meeting. Motion to pass by Steve Swenson, seconded by Scott Putnam, motion carried.

Treasurer's report - Motion to pass by Doug Liphart, seconded by Cheril Reis, motion carried. \$1.846.05

Old Business

- 1. Report on Adaptive State Meet Adaptive Scoring (John Burke)
 - a. There were two visually impaired youth, nothing was adjusted in the scoring for them. They are included in results as regular skiers. They didn't have parents' permission etc. If they were moved up 0.97 percent, they would move up about 25 skiers. There was one sit skier that did a different course
 - b. Motion by Scott Putnam that we incorporate a trial for adaptive scoring for individual and team based on US Paralympics standards. A committee will be in charge of collecting information and communicating criteria and results to the group at the Spring meeting. Seconded by Doug Liphart. Motion carried. (Yuriy Gusev, John Burke, Doug Liphart on committee)

2. Committee Reports

a. Allocation Committee Report –(Tracy Gorzek)

- i. The format was updated. Cleaned up from what was updated in the spring.
- ii. Question about whether we can have the Birkie Foundation in charge of scholarships.
- iii. Discussion on whether we want to give funds out based on what we have, or have a floor or cap on how much to give out.
- iv. Doug Liphart moved to table until spring. Asked committee to create parameters (who can apply etc.) Seconded by Jim Mullen, motion carried.
- b. Guest Class Committee Report Ted Theyerl
 - Concern about 100 additional skiers (committee decision was based on number of bibs). Committee to approve and go over applications from other states teams.
 - ii. Motion by Tracy Gorzek motion to moves to accept on a trial basis, seconded by Dalt Collins.
 - iii. Amended to say 25 per gender, AND Individuals on teams participating in the competition are eligible under 2 above (in 3). Limited to 25 per gender (50 total), 10 per team total (either gender). Motion carried.
- c. MS age group award proposal for league races- Jim Wood
 - i. Purpose to encourage middle school younger members to ski.
 - Steve Swenson makes motion to accept this as written and include conference and state. Seconded by Yuriy Gusev. Discussion. Steve Swenson withdraws the motion.
 - iii. Steve Scharrer moved to accept as trial per Rachel Kresse's suggestions during discussion: conference awards up to each conference, state meet follows the rules of competition.) Encourage the timer to have subcategory of 5th and 6th grade results. Seconded by Jim Mullen. Motion carried.
- 3. Clarification of State Meet waxing and pole length rules (Ted Theyerl)
 - a. No pole length rules at state. Awareness that higher level meets will have rules.
 - b. Waxing at state meet adopting Junior Cup rules (none on skating, classic no pure fluoros on tips and tails.) Deciding at spring meeting. Other meets its up to the race director.
 - c. If it's FIS rules, pole length applies. Are we enforcing it? Are we ALL telling each other? List we can give jury to let them know who is short on equipment.

New Business

 - a. Cutting out Sat evening awards. Have two awards ceremonies during Saturday.

- b. No banquet dinner, ice cream social Saturday afternoon.
- c. Coaches awards before later awards Saturday.

- e. Middle school then high school on Sunday. Currently have tentative start times. Sunday is pursuit. 2-lap high school event.
