2023 WNSL State Championship Prediction

BAM! POW! SHAZAM! Like the sharp twist of an action movie plot, the Wisconsin Nordic High School League coaches have reshaped the championship predictions. At the spring meeting of 2022 they voted to combine the points awarded at the sprint championship, currently in Middleton, with the pursuit distance places at the Birkie Start in Cable, effectively smashing my antique crystal ball to smithereens.

This historic and unprecedented action will have far reaching ramifications. First, a heck of a lot more kids and teams will be showing up in Middleton. If you want to play the game in Cable and have a chance of placing, for both teams and individuals, the first step is sprinting. Current entries show 280 skiers versus 130 last year.

In some ways, the individual calculations are pretty straightforward. Win the individual sprint title in Madison, head north next weekend, win the distance pursuit, Voilà: State Champion, The Grand Poobah, the Sultan of Skiing, Wisconsin High School Nordic style. Further down the line, closer to reality, points become important.

Using the World Cup points system, 1st=30 points, 2nd=29 pts, 3rd=29 pts, down to 30th place. This works well for the individuals as the Pursuit portion is really two races in one and thus the points in Cable will double: 1st=60 pts, 2nd=58 pts, etc., down to 30th=2 pts, and that's with individuals and guest class eliminated.

As far as teams, hang in there with me here. At the sprints, classic team sprints are on Saturday. Each state team can enter up to three teams for Boys, Girls, and Mixed classes, however only the top two from each team can count toward points total. Here the points are 1st=45 pts, 2nd=43pts, down to 21st=1pt. Mixed relay scoring numbers are 1st=87, 2nd=85, down to 20th=49.

Right....got it.

And not to confuse the linear flow of thought, but the sprints on Sunday will be individual freestyle, with team points added in at the end that will be familiar to some where the top three individual place scores will be added together.

If you want more details, being that sort of person, check out the WNSL Rules of Competition for an entertaining read.

Of course the drama doesn't end in math class, history is also exciting, and among the potential pile of individual contenders two jump out, Casey VanHefty, Lakeland, for the boys and Fran Peterson, Chippewa Valley Nordic for the girls. As last year's champions, the obvious choices, now favored heavily as both won at the Middleton individual sprints. Van Hefty also won the team relay title with ski buddy Leo Rotar for the weekend leading up to the distance races at Cable.

Strong, healthy, peaking, what could possibly go wrong? A herd of thundering skis in the rear view mirror comes to mind.

The sprint weekend, aside from Fran and Casey's pleasing results, yielded motivation for the Cable affair. Those relegated to chasing bibs in Middleton are looking for revenge in a longer 7.1k deal amidst the Birkie terrain. Sprint days require four times full out around a course ranging from 1-1.5k, somewhat like running 800m to 1500m in track as far as a time/energy expenditure, four times in a day's competition. Many skiers with a preponderance of slow twitch muscles but proper conditioning will be thinking, "My turn!" So let the fun begin.

One skier turning heads this year is Ben Dohlby, Peak. He's beaten Van Hefty a number of times in both skate and classic techniques, which will be the Saturday individual starts and Sunday pursuit style this year. For a skier seventh at state last year, quite a jump. This could be interesting. His teammate, Easton Tolbert, is close behind and also could make a run at the top ten and perhaps podium.

Other names that quickly come to mind are a pair from Ashwaubenon Nordic Ski Team; Joe Stumpf and Noah Jahnke. Both have had a whack at Van Hefty this season and come out on top here and there.

The Iola Winter Sports Club has a clone machine of tall, thin, lanky boys. The numbers keep building and they're due for some top places soon with the likes of Charlie Vater and Bode Erickson. Waiting in the wings, ready to pop a good one, are Ian Anderson, Huba Bodar-Gasztony, and Cole Anderson. Plenty of firepower there.

Another boy's team looking fantastic in their self designed new teamuni's are Aiden Ecker, Jack Dahlbey and Kristian Hudacek; podium possibilities.

So for the boy's individual title I'm calling Casey Van Hefty as he seems to have it all together for both sprints and distance, and is a well rounded skier in both techniques. Chasing him for places will be any of the above mentioned names, plus Dietrich Mattison, Blackhawk.

The girls will have their hands full with Fran Peterson and my bet's on her. Just like Casey, she can handle most anything and with a state title under her belt is not likely to give up places easily. Skiing hard is her teammate Mady Rosenberger, fourth in the individual sprints and training with a teammate like Fran, she'd like nothing more than to share podium hugs and smiles as seniors.

Over at Lakeland, Grace Kern, and skiing sisters Sylvia and Stella Meza are flying high from the sprint title last weekend. A team threat for sure in the distance race.

Not too far back in the points Wausau Nordic United has three girls who have flown under the radar, but are starting to turn heads. The trio of Eleanor Bennett, Tori Meyers, and Margaret Bennett came in second at the Middleton sprints, edging out the likes of perennial girl's powerhouse, Peak, and the girls from Iola Winter Sports Club, Josephine Kwazny, Greta Dickman, and Margaret Frieze. Impressive!

The girl's top three after Peterson is wide open. Peak has Anne Straka and Krin Blegen, the Iola girls, ANST with Lilly Franzen, Lauren Carlton, all ready to go. Sophie Stevenson, Blackhawk comes to mind, along with Lakeland's three some. Any of them could have a good weekend and show off their powers, but what of the numbers? I need a new computer and a grandchild to help me out on this one.

I need to mention the incoming class, in a year or two. This is a high school championship, but differs from many sports as we include a middle school class. While they are not a part of the changes mentioned with a combination of sprints and distance results, I think they are still worth mentioning as they are the wave of the future. No high school without a middle school. No middle school without an elementary. Each level should be recognized and reinforced locally. It's the only way we grow sustainably, and that includes the coaches.

And speaking of unsung heroes, team managers are unheralded and under appreciated. They take on the responsibility of herding sheep, feeding the flock, managing accommodations, family needs, and team drama. God bless them.

Finally a historic touch, my minor, and dear to my heart, if not my memory. Checking various documents and records, it appears that a "three peat" champion is a rare commodity in the state. Do your own research, but checking back I see a fair number of two time state champions, boys and girls. Three peat? Not so much.

Among the girls, Heather Ashby/Higgins,(Lakeland) 1990,1992,1993, and Aniya Dietz ("The Aniyalator") Fifield, 1997-1999. For the boys, Simon Shepard, River Falls, 1983-85, a mere forty or so years ago. This year? We'll see. Drama, math, and history all coinciding in Cable, February 11-12, 2023. Be there or be square.



Course/Venue Information

PLEASE BE SURE TO ACCESS THE VENUE VIA TELEMAR RD AND NOT MCNAUGHT

The 2023 State meet courses start in the Birkie Stadium. Skiers for both days, Middle School and High School, will enter the course by walking past the Timing/Warming Hut and proceed through to the Start area or tracks headed south towards the Birkie Skate Trail. The race course proceeds from the start up to the left hand turn onto Snowmaker, climbs onto the old Korteloppet trail which climbs up to “The Rock” at 1 kilometer.

Skiers then take a sharp right hand turn and descend on the Birkie Classic trail, reverse of normal flow, and then left onto the Birkie Skate trail. This continues past the 2k mark until it meets with the section of the World Cup Trail that we’ve previously skied in the opposite direction. A hard left at that point takes you 600 meters back to “The Rock” and just past the 3k marker.

A right hand turn at The Rock takes you onto the Birkie Classic Trail, reverse direction from what we’ve skied past years. This continues back to the Birkie Skate Trail for a very brief section before another left hand turn feeds skiers onto The Birkie Roller at around the 4K mark.

This trail will essentially lead us past 5 and 6 kilometers coming back into the competition stadium

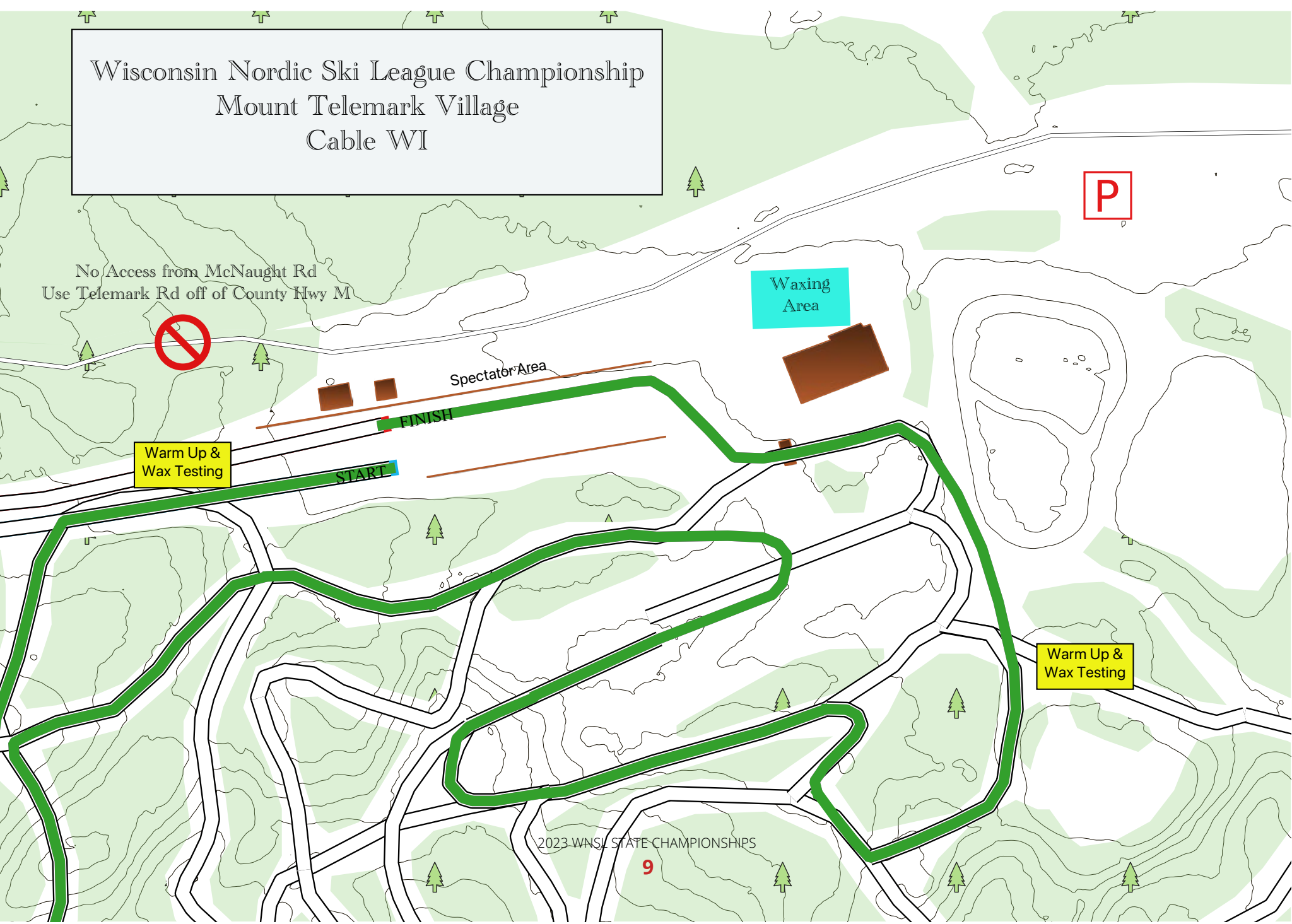
and then up a final ascent of the new stadium climb and around the Pond Loop for a total distance of 7.1 kilometers. Skiers will enter the Birkie stadium by going over the tunnel, a swooping right hand turn, and another gentle left hand turn to lead them on to the finish straight away as we have in the past.

Warmups will be conducted on the Birkie Skate Trail behind the finish area and extend to where the Birkie Classic and Skate trails separate. Also groomed and open for testing and warmups will be the trails to the east of the Great Hall, climbing up to Telemark Condo Rd.

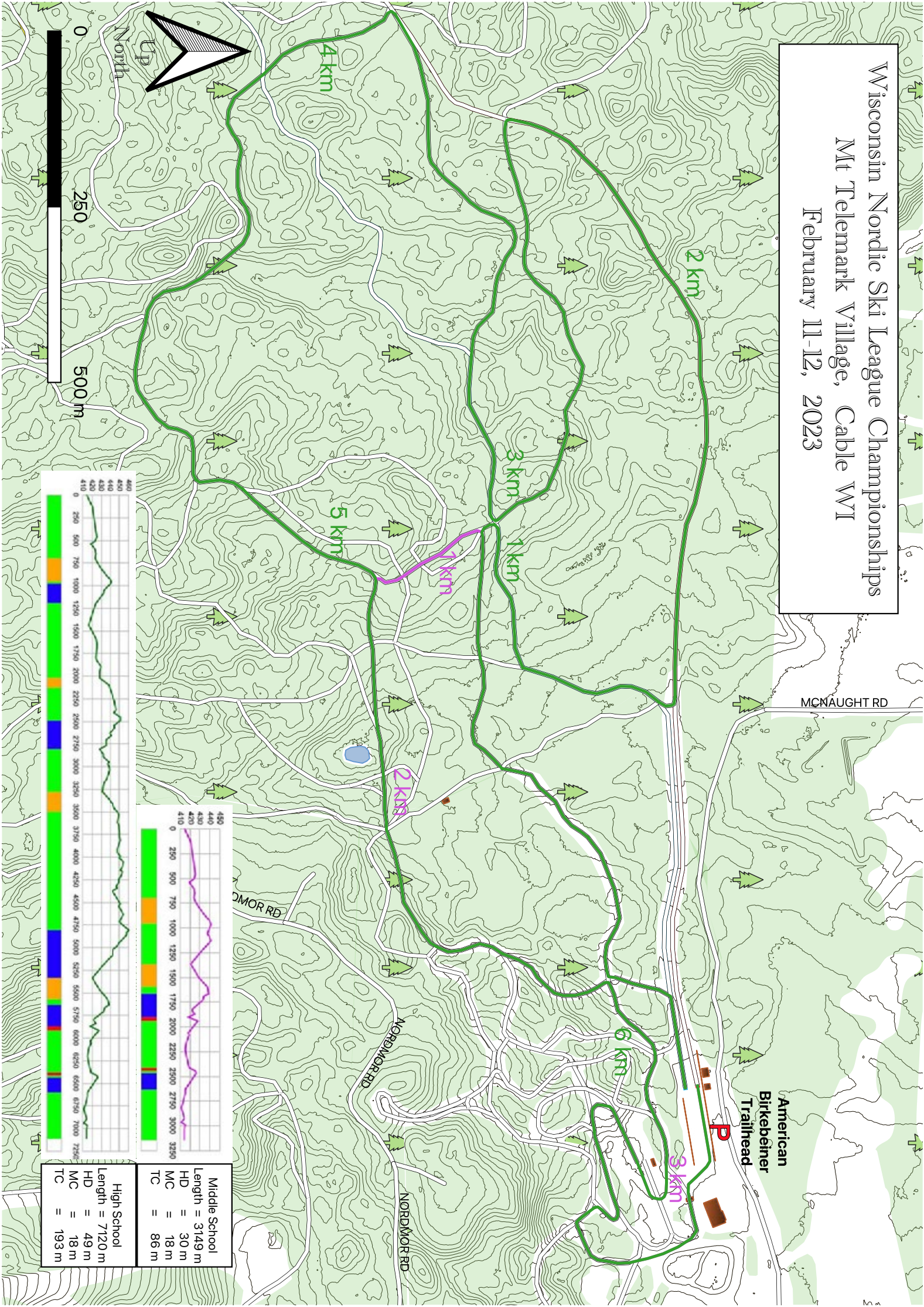
Middle School Course Description

The Middle School course and high school course are the same up to “The Rock”. At that point MS will turn left for a short way and then rejoin the HS course onto the Birkie Roller where they will ski for the remainder of their course on the HS course entering the finish stadium as the high school course described for a total of 3k.

2023 Coach of the Year

Dale Fanney

Dale Fanney has been coaching Nordic skiing since 2003, first with the middle school program at MadNorSki and then started the program in Lodi in 2005. His daughters were on the Madison team and they were interested in starting their own team with friends closer to home. His goal was to create a ski culture in Lodi with HS and MS teams that practiced after school on their own xc trails at relatively low cost. At the time, Lodi had no ski families, no Birkie skiers, no ski trails, no coaches, no money or equipment and no community awareness of what Nordic skiing was. In Dale's first year they had 14 skiers, the next year 35! They built a 3k trail at the golf course which is now 7.5k. They groomed with a Polaris 500 and box springs and hog fencing, now have a dedicated Ginzu grooming and Skandic sleds. They also built a warming shed on wheels, but last year built a garage and warming shelter. Dale's kids skied on donated equipment and given their blue collar status, they still provide ski equipment to about 80% of their skiers with registration. They started a Youth Ski program on 2007 and now have 61 kids using waxless classical skis that they keep all winter at a cost of \$60 for the winter.

About 6-7 years ago, Dale organized a South Conference Fall Meeting that he has been chairing. As a result of his leadership, the Southern Conf. is ahead of the curve when it comes to organization within the WSNL. Over the years, Dale has organized low-cost races and provides his own timing, such as the Season Opener at ABR in early December and the Lodi Invitational in mid-December. These races have been very successful and have served as a model around the State. Dale began skiing at McGill University in 1970. He skied his first Birkie in 1986, has participated in 9 Worldloppet races and 5 Masters World Cups. Dale retired from full-time Family Medicine in 2018. He reflects, "How in the world I ever coached while practicing medicine is beyond me. I feel that we have been successful in establishing a Nordic culture in the Lodi, Waunakee, Deforest, Baraboo area where there was none before. Although we have not produced many Top 10 finishers at State or had many Team podium finishes, we have graduated about 400 skiers, most of whom continue to ski. Some have started collegiate xc clubs. Probably over 250 skiers and parents have participated in the Birkie and Korteloppet over 17 years."

Lifetime Achievement Award

John Burke

Most people when they think “lifetime” have a cradle to grave definition in mind. The Wisconsin Nordic Development Group offers our award to a person still with us who has accomplished in a few decades what many would take a full lifetime to achieve; John Burke.

Our sport is still relatively young compared to others in our state. 42 years ago, at the first state meet, skis, waxes, techniques, and timing were all primitive compared to what we have today. In particular, timing was a handheld affair with a few clipboards and handwritten results that eventually were transcribed into a typed form.

Mass starts were common, easy to time and would have a running order that could be easily posted and visible for athletes, parents, and coaches as skiers crossed the line. Interval starts? Pursuits? A different beast with calculations error prone and long wait times post race annoying and frustrating. Sprints? Not yet on the horizon.

The rise of the computer changed the timing of our sport dramatically and John Burke, Performance Timing, has been a key component of making those adaptations effective and user friendly.

Today team rosters are handled electronically. Race waiver and entries all via the computer/ internet. Registration rosters, start lists, seeding of races, randomized groups within the seeds, bib assigning, day of race scheduling, and of course results, instantly appearing on the web are taken for granted. John has worked now for decades to make those transitions effective and to educate coaches and team managers how to incorporate those new technologies into action.

Years ago, like many of us, John and his wife, Beth, stumbled onto the sport of cross country skiing. Travels to other states on behalf of insurance work caused breaks in continuity, but back in Wausau, Wisconsin, their talents and drive led to the organization of their timing services and the timing of one of Wisconsin’s oldest citizens races, the Sneekevik Classic in 2007.



Along the way, John was the Race Director at one of the last club organized high school championships as Wausau hosted the state meet in Wausau in 2010-11, in addition to expanding his timing business into track, cross country running, biking, snowshoeing, and community events needing his services.

Also, as part of his ongoing desire to serve and impact our sport, he has served as President of the Wausau Nordic Ski Club, one of the founding clubs statewide.

The Wisconsin Nordic Development Group evolved from a concept in John's office to the 10 year run it has had organizing and running the state meet. John has been instrumental in the ongoing monthly meetings of the group, originally held in his living room. Job descriptions have become more pronounced among the ten volunteers, but John has continued as the treasurer and chief of not only timing, but also communication and structural organization. He wears many hats well.

John's skill and commitment to running a "class act" goes beyond any contract or business relationship; cross country skiing, especially at the high school and middle school level is his passion having earlier had his own daughters skiing and living through the excitement of that phase of life.

The sport continues to evolve as Covid led to the advent of the Zoom meetings for coaches, volunteers, and organizers. Today, John is there with the links, the Power Points, the maps, graphs, charts, timelines, spreadsheets, and visuals. A vital component of skillful professionalism that makes the meetings flow smoothly.

Wisconsin Nordic skiing is changing again as this is the second year of transition as the Wisconsin Nordic Ski League of coach representatives take control of the championship and use the funds to decide the best path for the future of our sport. John has taken on a new responsibility as Chief of Timing of both the sprint and distance weekends and a new method of crowning both individuals and teams is tried for this, the first year. John will work between timers and his points calculations to ensure champions are crowned at the end of the traditional pursuit, blending both weekends results together as we aim for the final awards of the season.

It's interesting where life's pathway will take you. With John and Beth Burke, and on behalf of all of us who love the sport, we're so glad and fortunate our paths crossed. Here's to many more years.

The team evolved from the youth Kickin' Kids Learn to Ski program held Mondays during the winter at Tower Ridge ski area since the early 1990's. ABOUT

The Lakeland Nordic Ski Team was started in 1980 with the intent of bringing high school skiers along to citizen races and starting them out in the sport. It was aligned with the adult oriented Lakeland Ski Club and traveled to races in the Northern Wisconsin area. Eventually those young skiers decided to try their skiing at a higher level and began competing in Michigan and Minnesota in the hopes of making the Midwest/Central Junior National Team. Within two years, the team had become a part of the Lakeland High School and was accepted as a club team, while still supported by the ski club, and in 1982 Lakeland hosted the first ever Wisconsin High School X-C Race, Saturday, January 10, 1982 at Minocqua Winter Park. The girls won and the boys placed second on a weather shortened course with -19 at race start and high winds.

Today the club continues to operate as a school sponsored club that functions like a varsity sport. Schedules are set by the head coach, who is hired and approved by the volunteer governing board, grades and customary paperwork are monitored by the school, uniforms are paid for through club fund raisers, athletes are excused from school as per other sports, vans for travel and insurance are paid for by the district, while entry fees, coaching salaries, wax, and travel expenses are absorbed by the club through a combination of athlete fees and fund raising efforts. The club has expanded to include elementary from fourth grade into the Middle School years and usually has about 50 members in the three areas with a number of coaches, both paid and volunteer that support at each level. The goals of the team include friendship, fun, and skiing fast!

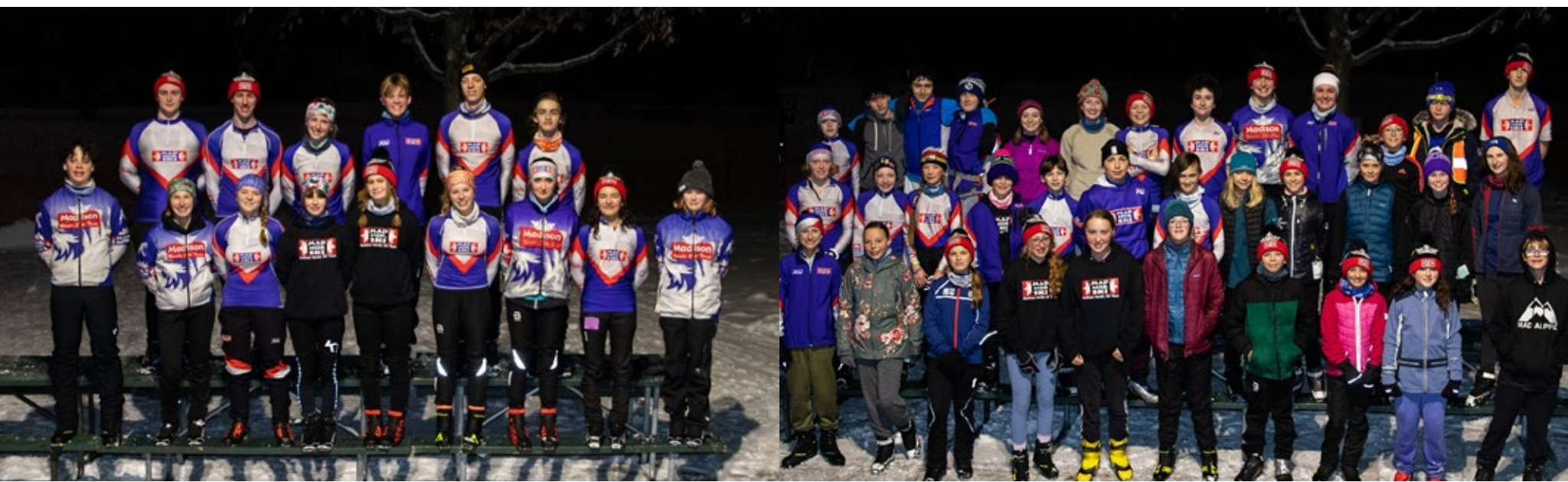
